St. Aug's, Metairie Hosts Signing at its Book and Gift Store

The Reverend Doctor Dennis R. Maynard, Episcopal priest, author, and teacher will appear on **Sunday, September 20**, at St. Augustine's Episcopal Church in Metairie to discuss and expand on the themes in his book *Forgive and Get Your Life Back*. St. Augustine's Bookstore is sponsoring the **6:00 p.m.** event.

This book, first published in 1994, was redeveloped as a teaching tool at the request of other clergy so that it could be used as a basis for forgiveness workshops in church parishes. Following the lecture, the Rev. Dr. Maynard will sign his books which also include *Those Episkopols* and the *Magnolia* series of novels about the experiences of a priest and "the underside of parish life" in the South.

Born in Kansas, the Rev. Dr. Maynard was ordained to the priesthood at the age of 23 in Oklahoma. He has been affiliated with churches in the Dioceses of Oklahoma, Dallas, Upper South Carolina, Texas and San Diego, has served on the board of the National Association of Episcopal Schools and as an adjunct member of the faculty at Seabury Western Seminary.

It's the Long Green Season

The church is now in what is known variously as "the long green season," "the season after Pentecost," or "ordinary time." It is called the long green season because green paraments and vestments will be in place until Christ the King Sunday, which falls this year on November 22.

Pentecost means 50 days, as it falls 50 days after Easter. The season after Pentecost is the more correct liturgical reference. It has a much older history, however. In the Old Testament it was known as the "Feast of the Weeks" and included harvesting of the first spring crops.

For Christians, Pentecost is the marking of the gift of the Holy Spirit coming into the community. It is, therefore, very appropriate that in this season after Pentecost, readings for Sundays focus on how to be a community bearing the name of Christ.

The disciples did not instinctively know how to be the beloved community. They didn't know where the Holy Spirit would take them but Jesus reassures them, comforts them, that whatever they face, he will not leave them without and advocate, without guidance on what to do.

Jesus gives them the Holy Spirit, but he gives them something else as well; he gives them each other in all their faithfulness and foibles, all their compassion and conflicts with one another.

We were never meant to go it alone. We were never meant to keep Christ just to ourselves. The season after Pentecost is where we concentrate on how to be the church that Jesus wants us to be.

It is the season where all things are possible in the Holy Spirit.
